#### **TORNADO SIREN**

An emergency siren has been installed near the intersection of County Farm and Cedar Valley, approximately one mile north of Coon Lake Road. A monthly test will be conducted on the first Thursday of each month at 9:00 am. The siren is used <u>only for tornados</u>—not all inclement weather. There is no "all clear" signal. If you hear the siren any time other than the normal testing time, take cover and listen for the all clear on the radio. Any questions should be directed to Township
