Recycle Bins

Recycle bins are located behind the township hall and are available 24/7. Most items are accepted with the exception of plastic bags, waxed cardboard, Styrofoam, and they no longer accept any glass. There is no need to separate your materials by type. The township pays by volume, not weight, so PLEASE CRUSH YOUR STUFF before depositing it in the bin.

Also available in the main entrance to the township offices, you will find recycle bins for household batteries and hearing aids, prescription eyewear, and cell phones. We also collect seasonal items such as used Christmas lights during the holidays. There is a Gleaners collection box in the lobby for non-perishable food item donations.
